



There were **seven attacks in Paris** carried out by militants, killing at least 130 people.





The first attacks were launched virtually simultaneously, with two explosions close to the **Stade de France** at just after 9.20pm local time

The attackers opened fire on a restaurant and a bar on the other side of the road.

The next attack was directed at a pizzeria and opened fire on diners, killing at least five.



From there the militants opened fire on a bar At least 19 people died after the terrace was sprayed with bullets at around 9.35pm.

The next attack, at the Bataclan concert venue was the most deadly.

There, at least 89 people lost their lives when they were shot by black-clad gunmen wielding AK-47s and wearing suicide vests.
